Cops probe under way



Four Burton officers investigated over 'professional misconduct' claim

A POLICE officer has been suspended and three others have been taken off front-line duties following allegations of professional misconduct.

Staffordshire Police confirmed to the Mail that a major investigation had been launched into the conduct of four of its officers, all of whom are based at Burton Police Station.

The nature of the complaint resulting in the officers being pulled from active duty has been described

as of a 'confidential nature'.

A spokesman for the force told the Mail: "One police officer has been suspended and three officers have been moved from their duties within East Staffordshire Local Policing Team, based in Burton, to non-operational roles elsewhere in the force."

"This follows an allegation of professional misconduct."

"An investigation into the allegations is now under way."
