

# Blood donation plea by cancer stricken women

**A BURTON woman battling to beat cancer is urging people to 'Take Five Minutes' and register to become a blood donor.**

Katherine Sinfield made the plea as she continues to fight leukaemia.

Her plight has been highlighted in a Burton Mail campaign as the 32-year-old teacher has been told that she needs a bone marrow transplant to survive.

In her daily struggle against the disease, the Balfour Street resident uses up to two bags of blood at a time as part of her treatment.

Now she is asking Mail readers to 'give blood' which will help her carry on fighting and may also lead to a bone marrow match being uncovered.

She told the Mail: "I get through quite a bit of blood and this is why it is vital for as many people as possible to give donations.

"Not only can they register to become a bone marrow donor but they can also donate and help out so many people, not just me.

"So I ask people to 'Take Five Minutes' and register to be a blood donor and then set aside around an hour to give blood."

Katherine needs daily doses of antibiotics, fungal drips and blood transfusions after being diagnosed with chronic myeloid leukaemia in April.

She has remained in hospital, in Birmingham, for the last six weeks after doctors said her only hope of survival was to receive a bone marrow transplant.

Take Five Minutes campaign in a bid to locate a suitable donor, not just for Katherine, but for anyone who is in her position.

NHS Blood and Transplant service is holding a special event later this month for people in Burton and South Derbyshire to become a 'summer superhero'.
