Sport support for budding local athletes

The initiative is available to anyone showing talent in sport, and offers assistance to sportsmen and women to enable them to reach their full potential at regional, national and international levels.

Successful applicants will gain free use of the facilities at Green Bank and Etwall leisure centres and could also receive a financial grant.

In 2013, almost 40 athletes were successful applicants for a range of sports including kayaking and netball.

It allowed one applicant, Thomas Taylor, to win a silver medal with the Great British archery team.

Councillor Jim Hewlett for Derbyshire District Council said: "This is a great opportunity for local sports enthusiasts to receive a helping hand with their sports training.

"We are proud to be building an Olympic legacy and hope many local people will benefit from the scheme."

Mrs Sinfield, of Balfour Street, said: "The facts are simple, the more funding Cure Leukaemia receives, the more ground breaking drugs the charity can trial on patients in urgent need of a lifeline.

"These drugs aren't available on the NHS and so this is literally a matter of life and death.'
