A PROTECTED tree under threat of falling in high winds will be shortened in height by 20 feet, after a planning appli-

cation was approved. The lime tree, at 57 Bank Street, Castle Gresley is covered by a tree preservation order (TPO) and as such Darren Prince, of Bank Street, had to apply to South Derbyshire District Council for permission to prune it.

In his application he said: "The tree is growing very high and I have concerns of it falling, particularly in high winds. There is a road, cars and houses nearby which are at risk if the tree fell."

ers from Birmingham-based charity Cure Leukaemia to receive the cash from Atlantic rowers Alex Bland and Harry Martin-Dreyer. The pair rowed 3,000 miles across the

Atlantic in 50 days to raise more than £203,000, which was split between Cure Leukaemia and diabetes charity JDRF.
